## **Pathways of agroforestry systems in Mediterranean protected landscapes: a social-ecological perspective**

**ABSTRACT:** In the context of the ongoing global change, among the diversity of agro-ecological practices that intend to reach both food production and environmental issues, agroforestry systems (AFS) have the specificity to integrate woody vegetation, crops and/or livestock on the same area of land. Here we identified contrasted but inter-connected AFS and social-ecological processes, particularly socio-political ones, explaining their dynamics in two Mediterranean protected areas: **Ventoux biosphere reserve** and **Verdon regional nature park**. In both cases, ongoing changes (wolf resettlement, increased droughts, political changes...) call into question the arrangements implemented by stakeholders, inducing new coordination challenges.
